The palate is well balanced with good weight, quite fresh and saline with a vibrant, lightly spiced finish. 2020	<a href="#">Les Parcelles de Saulx</a>		<a href="#">Chassagne-Montrachet En Morgeot 1er Cru</a>	The 2020 Chassagne-Montrachet En Morgeot 1er Cru offers light citrus fruit, crushed stone and pressed white flower scents on the nose that take their time to unfurl. The palate is well balanced with a slightly honeyed texture on the entry, a fine line of acidity, a little richer than the selection of other whites tasted from this producer with ample weight on the finish. The palate is ripe and quite complex with sweet raspberry and strawberry notes, fine acidity but for me, just a little generic on the finish. The palate is medium-bodied with fine tannins, good acidity, satisfying structure with a bit of an abrupt finish. 2020	<a href="#">Les Parcelles de Saulx</a>		<a href="#">Aloxe-Corton Les Fournieres 1er Cru</a>	The 2020 Aloxe-Corton Les Fournieres 1er Cru has a mixture of red and blueberry fruit on the nose, fine definition, a little more floral than the Les Boutieres by comparison. The palate is medium-bodied with dark berry fruit, quite granular in texture, fine acidity with a slightly heavy, bitter finish. 2020	<a href="#">Les Parcelles de Saulx</a>		<a href="#">Volnay Villages</a>	The 2020 Volnay Villages has an elegant and quite pure bouquet with raspberry, wild strawberry and briary scents that gain intensity with aeration. The palate is medium-bodied with supple tannins, fine acidity, quite sweet with cassis notes towards the finish. 2020	<a href="#">Les Parcelles de Saulx</a>		<a href="#">Volnay Les Mitans 1er Cru</a>	The 2020 Volnay Les Mitans 1er Cru has an elegant and pure bouquet with red cherries and crushed strawberry fruit, well defined with subtle crushed rose petal scents. The palate is well balanced with fine definition, taut and fresh, quite chiselled tannins with a poised finish. The palate is medium-bodied with chewy tannins on the entry, but good weight and fine acidity. Dark berry fruit laced with white pepper towards the finish, a little "stocky" perhaps however, there is satisfying length. 2020	<a href="#">Les Parcelles de Saulx</a>		<a href="#">Gevrey-Chambertin Les Corbeaux 1er Cru</a>	The 2020 Gevrey-Chambertin Les Corbeaux 1er Cru is well-defined on the nose with open-knit red berry fruit, rose petal and a touch of orange rind. The palate is medium-bodied with firm tannins. A little rigid at the moment, there is decent weight here although I am seeking just a little more complexity and terroir expression on the finish. 2020	<a href="#">Les Parcelles de Saulx</a>		<a href="#">Chapelle-Chambertin Grand Cru</a>	The 2020 Chapelle-Chambertin Grand Cru offers a mixture of red and black fruit on the nose, touches of chalk dust plus a light seaweed scent (Japanese nori perhaps?) The palate is medium-bodied with firm tannins, quite voluminous, fine grip with crisp reductant and cranberry on the finish.
